# History

The Children's Rehabilitation Institute of TeletonUSA (CRIT-USA) is funded by TeletonUSA Foundation. The Foundation is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. The model of care used by CRIT-USA exemplifies 19 years of specialized pediatric rehabilitation care and services for children with disabilities and their family's therapies developed by the Teleton Foundation Mexico, which funds and operates 22 children's rehabilitation centers throughout Mexico. Collectively the CRIT model of care represents the largest private children's rehabilitation system in the world.



Expense for 1 year of outpatient rehabilitation treatment for a child at CRIT-USA.


The average cost of treatment for a child at other institutions. - Based on Medicaid

#### Pay-what-you-can

Patients at CRIT-USA pay according to their ability or financial means. Payment is based on a sliding scale according to federal poverty guidelines.

Medical insurance is not required.


#### Foundation Overview

The mission of Fundacion TeletonUSA ("TeletonUSA Foundation") is to raise critical funds and awareness, inspiring a more inclusive, accepting world for children with disabilities and their families while empowering them to live their lives to the fullest potential. Our vision is a nation where every child and every family can live full, joyful lives and have access to state-of-the-art rehabilitation, regardless of their ability to pay.

In 2012, the foundation committed to help provide financial resources to ensure the success and performance of CRIT-USA. The foundation board operations are guided by the foundation by-laws and the affiliation agreement signed between the foundation and CRIT-USA. The foundation is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization registered with both the IRS and the Texas Secretary of State.

Members of the board of directors are uncompensated volunteers committed to support-ing CRIT-USA, its patients and their families. The current focus of the board is fundraising for CRIT-USA operations, pediatric rehabilitation programming services and establishing endowments to create ongoing rehabilitative health care services and build future facilities nationwide. The foundation has secured over \$60 million since 2014 and awarded through its 3 annual fundraising venues: The Annual TeletonUSA 30 hour live broadcast on Univision, the Annual Piggy Bank campaign along with online and personal donations.
